Program Highlights

Humane Aid for Community Organization (HACO) in the year 2021 through the surpport of Our Donors; IRC, IOM and FAO successfully helped us implement, WASH, Protection-GBV Prevention and Response, FSL Programs in Panyijiar, Koch and Rubkona Counties in Unity State and in Mangateen IDP - Juba City; Central Equatoria state.

GBV Prevention and Response

Humane-Aid for Community Organization (HACO-NNGO) South Sudan, with support from IRC have continued working at Mangateen IDP Camp to enhance the prevention and response, mitigation of gender-based violence against women and girls in Mangateen, by providing GBV response services and prevention activities at the camp and training of stakeholders on Human rights and protection topics to improve the protection environment for women and girls affected by conflict. From 12th March 2021, humane Aid for Community Organization (HACO-NNGO) South Sudan, continued with several programs of GBV prevention and response activities at Mangateen IDP Camp. Humane Aid for Community Organization (HACO-NNGO) implemented several activities including;

- GBV trends analysis (assessment) was conducted to assess women and girls safety and security at the Camp.
- Information session with women and girls on available GBV services and needs of survivors.
- GBV basic concepts for community leaders
- Women leadership training and confidence building
- Group based life skills training as part of Psychosocial Support for women and girls
- Awareness session on women rights as granted by national law of South Sudan, regional Laws and international laws that promotes rights of women for people to adopt changes and respect for diversity.
- HACO conducted a five (5) days training on liquid Soap making process which is life skills for women and girls for economic empowerment for self-reliance

Food Security and Livelihoods

Humane Aid for Community Organization (HACO) was contracted by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United nations (FAO) to implement an Emergency Livelihood Response Program (ELRP) with a modality of direct distribution of (crop seeds, vegetable seeds, agriculture hand tools and fishing kits) and training support to a caseload of 6,975 households in Panyijiar County/Unity State during the Main Season Response (MSR) 2021 in Four (4) selected Payams/Bomas; Ganyliel, Pachar, Pachak, Pachienjok and in December 2021 -DSR to support with vegetable and Fishing kits and training to a caseload of 4,000 HHs (in three payams of Bentiu, Rubkona and Nyialdiu) Households in Rubkona County. The overall objective was to contribute to

protecting vulnerable populations against hunger, destitution and malnutrition because they were affected by the triple crisis of floods, insecurity and multiple displacements.

Improving agricultural Production and fishing practices (Trainings)

HACO ELRP 2021 Panyijiar County project team formed groups of crop farming members for training, following the guidelines provided in the LoA with FAOSS. One Demonstration garden was opened per Payam, all totaling to five (Ganyliel, Pachar, Pachak, Thoanhoam and Pachienjok).

A package of training on crop farming demonstration gardens was provided to the trainees per each training group/session. Those selected for training in best agronomic practices were trained at different times to avoid crowding and to ensure adherence to COVID-19 risk reduction SOPs: social distancing, No handshakes, constant washing of Hands with soap and sanitizing and wearing of facemasks.

The training was in agriculture/crop production, land preparation, vegetable garden layout, seed rate and methods of planting, row planting method, preparing nursery and nursing techniques, training in ways of drainage during floods like constructing dykes as well as water conservation during dry spells like mulching, and how to control pests using the available local methods. I50 individuals were targeted for the training in best agronomic practices. A demonstration plot was set up in each Payam. Training was also conducted for fishing groups in best fishing methods, fish handling and fish preservation techniques. The training targeted I50 individuals from (5 Fishing groups formed; one group per Payam). All I50 targeted individuals for trainings in best fishing practices were trained. The trainings were conducted following COVID-19 risk reduction strategies.

Emergency Livelihood Support to food insecure farming households in Nyal, Kol and Mayom Payams in Panyijiar County (Funded by RRF/IOM)

Panyijiar County experienced multiple shocks in 2020. Namely; cattle rustling, localized violence, floods and resultant crop losses and failure. This crisis led to multiple displacements especially in greater Ganyliel and greater Nyal. The result of the crop losses and death of herds of domestic animals gave rise to high levels of food insecurity and malnutrition with GAM rates of over 30%. In order to forestall widespread food insecurity and malnutrition, Humane aid for community organization with the support of RRF and seconded by the FSL cluster in March 2021 responded to distribute agricultural inputs (Vegetable and fishing kits) to 3100 vulnerable households in Nyal, Kol and Mayom Payams. Another component of the response was to offer training to selected/model fisher folks in best fishing, fish handling and preservation techniques.

WASH Response

HACO in 2021 was involved in a WASH response in Koch County. This was in the two payams of Pakur and Boaw which are two of the nine Payams in Koch County in Unity State. The main villages in Boaw and Pakur are Loang, Pham, Buoth, Wumlit, Pakur, Nyaluok and Thayler. According to OCHA's Humanitarian Needs Overview for 2021, Koch County had over 71,000 people with significant humanitarian needs, which is equivalent to approximately 67% of the total projected population of Koch County reported in the HNO which were in IPC 4¹. The floods in Koch County which begun in May 2021 had however exacerbated the humanitarian situation in Koch County affecting over 6,045 Households (32,270 individuals) in Northern Koch County; Humane Aid for Community Organization (HACO) Flood assessment in Boaw and Pakur from 01st – 03rd September 2021 in Boaw and Pakur Payams, revealed that; homes were abandoned in the flood waters by the local people. Additionally, there was fear of Water borne diseases as flood waters remained stagnant. The affected Populations were displaced to Thoriak, Pakur (high grounds), Mar and Gor. At the time of the assessment, the Priorities for Immediate Humanitarian response were: preliminary hygiene and sanitation promotion with key action messages of; 'filter and purify water before drinking, Conducting hygiene awareness campaigns, Distribution of phase I flood response WASH NFIs such as aqua tabs, filter cloth, soap, buckets with taps and Jerricans. Following this assessment was the implementation of a Rapid Response Fund Emergency WASH services for flood affected communities of Pakur and Boaw Payams, Koch County, Unity State.
